**Notes from the Parish Executive**

The Parish Executive had its monthly meeting on Thursday, September 23.

In addition to regular business, the meeting focused on whether we can lessen some of the restrictions we put into place in response to the COVID-19 pandemic. Given that we have still not seen the other side of this pandemic, the Executive feels that we will maintain the requirement to social distance and to wear masks while in the building. We have, however, removed the directional arrows on the floor, opened the main doors to the sanctuary, and will be putting the prayer books back into the pews starting in October.



The issue that sparked the most discussion is whether to insist that people entering the church be double vaccinated, as some Ukrainian Orthodox parishes elsewhere in Canada are requiring. With our masking requirement, ability to social distance, and our requirement to sign in for the purposes of contact tracing, the majority of the Executive felt that the risk to our parishioners is much less than in other public places, such as supermarkets, stores, and libraries. After over a year of restrictions, we also did not want to place even more obstacles in the way of people wanting to visit God’s Temple. Of course, we will monitor events and revisit our decision should the public-health situation require it.

In other business, our Building Manager updated on the ongoing work in the basement to fix leaks in our heating system and we discussed an appropriate retirement gift from the parish for His Eminence, Metropolitan Yuriy.

Financially, our parish is doing reasonably well, though the month of August showed a significant deficit as a result of both the regular summer decline in donations combined with the fact that we paid for our annual insurance in that month. The Executive encourages everyone to sign up for regular direct-deposit donations, as this will ensure the parish has a predictable and steady source of income each month rather than having to deal with the summer drop in revenue as parishioners leave on summer vacation or go out to the cottage.

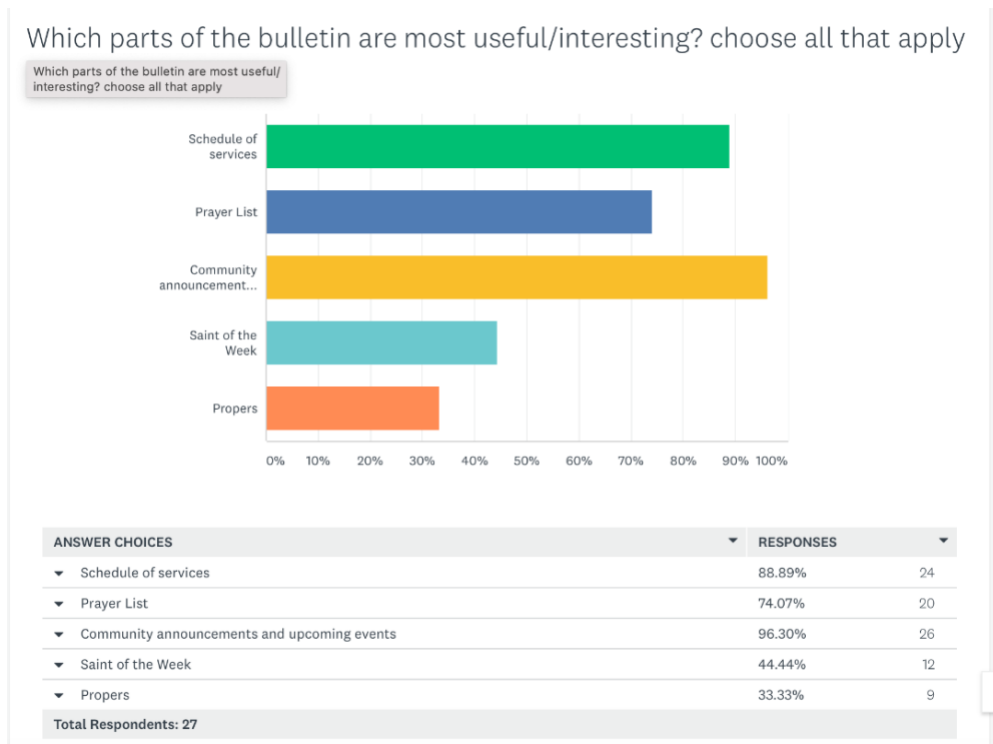

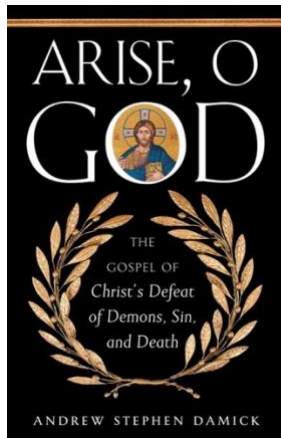
